# **Implementation date and additional rounds** 2011, 2012

#### Package coverage

Health warnings are required to cover 50% of the front and 50% of the back of the package. Overall, 50% of the package space is appropriated to health warnings.

#### **Rotation schedule and history**

Two warnings are used on cigarette packages.

#### **Restrictions on misleading information**

Misleading descriptors such as "light" and "mild" are prohibited from appearing on packages.

#### **Special notes**

In 2010, Honduras passed a law requiring pictorial health warnings to occupy 80% of the front and 80% of the back of the pack. Before the law was implemented in 2011, the Honduras congress voted to reduce the size of the pictorial warning labels to 50% of the front and 50% of the back.
